ALICE STILL IN THE CROSSCURRENTS

One Step Forward, Two Steps Back

In Escambia and Santa Rosa counties, 42.2% of households lived paycheck to paycheck in 2022. This included nearly 28,000 in poverty and another 50,000 who were **ALICE** – **A**sset Limited, Income **C**onstrained, **E**mployed – earning above poverty but less than the cost of basics.

While wages grew, three other factors – inflation, loss of pandemic supports, and a decade of falling behind – combined to keep ALICE trapped.
